Part I: Introduction

The Sonari Commerce College, located at Latitude 27.02N and Longitude 95.02E in Sonari town, the district headquarter of Charaideo, was established on 10th August, 1991. It is one of the best known leading institutions of higher education and one and only higher institution of commerce education in the entire district. Affiliated to Dibrugarh University and running presently Arts and Commerce stream in full swing, the institution also provides education of Higher Secondary course under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. Considering the continuously showing better academic performance in both H.S. Course and Degree Programme and to comply with the growing need of Science Education in the district, the Govt. of Assam has granted the Science Stream of Degree Programme in the college and the arrangement of it is progressing. In addition to these, the college introduces a Study Centre of Open and Distance Learning under Directorate of Open and Distance Learning (DODL), under Dibrugarh University, covering the Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes of both Arts and Commerce from the Academic Session 2021-22 to fulfill the hope of achieving higher education of those learners who are unable to pursue it in a regular mode for various causes. The College also introduces a number of Add-on Courses*. Besides the students of Assam, many students from the neighboring states like Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh are also studying in this institution. Its efforts to alert and make conscious the public to the importance of value education and fulfill the various academic needs of the society with further inclusion of newer subjects are on.

The college implements the National Education Policy, 2020, which aims to make education more inclusive, equitable and holistic. The college has secured B Grade in the first cycle of gradation by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and tries to improve its performance in future.

Vision:

The college has its vision of encouraging value based education among the student community. It is very honestly accelerating its activities in the field of its primary motive with newer techniques and innovations to fulfill its vision keeping a motto; "Gyanam Manusshya Netram Tritiyam", a Sanskrit Sloka from Bhagawad Gita which says, "Knowledge is the third eye of human being", since the college family believes in the power of knowledge on human being. By teaching the students of moral and practical value of education, the institution is improving their ability to judge the real and just. They are thereby trained to become skillfully able and productive and promising source of the nation.

No student is allowed to enter college campus without proper uniform.

Part II: General Information

Admission Procedure:

Candidates are required to register themselves in the SAMARTH online admission portal (www.samarth.ac.in) to get admission into Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP). Similarly, candidates have to register through online admission portal DARPON for admission into Higher Secondary Courses (Arts & Commerce). The concerned authority provides an Admission Notification which is uploaded in the college website (www.sonaricomcollege.org). Students seeking admission have to submit the Admission Form along with all requisite documents by using the Admission Portal of the college. Admission is generally made on merit basis. However, provision of reservation is made as per Reservation Guidelines of Govt. of Assam and Directorate of Higher Education. After submission of Admission Forms, Merit Lists are prepared and students are allowed to take admission accordingly.

Admission Board:

An Admission Board is constituted by the Principal to handle the matters relating to admission and the decision of the Board is fixed and final.

Registration:

After admission, the students have to fill-in the online Registration Form. The Council will send a Registration Card in due course. Students must collect their registration card from the college office in time. In case FYUG Programme, students are to register through the Online Examination Management System of Dibrugarh University.

Library Facility:

The college has a good central library for the use of students and teachers with full of sufficient books and related journals, periodicals and news papers. Both prescribed and reference books are available here. Students can borrow books from the library for a certain period of time using the Library Cards provided by the library. Moreover, every department has its own departmental library for the use of students and teachers. The library is availing membership of National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST) and National Digital Library of India (NDLI). Both the N-LIST and NDLI provide access to 6000+ and more than 1,64,300 e-books. The library of this college is automated by Software of University Library-Version -2 (SOUL-V2).

General Rules for using Library:

Students have to collect Library Cards from the library. Students can borrow two books at a time which they must return within a period of 7/ 15 days, otherwise they shall have to pay a late fine of Re. 1/-(one) per day. Students must get Library Clearance Certificate from the Librarian before issue of Admit Card for various examinations.

Attendance:

Attendance in the class is compulsory for all students. A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit in the End-semester examination. However, that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtained the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Head of the Departments/Principal of the college on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

The Head of the Departments/ Principal of the college shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to sit in the End- semester examinations in the various Programmes and send a copy of the same to the Controller of Examinations. Such students shall have to repeat the concerned Course(s) when it is offered next.

A student, whose attendance is found less than 70%, he/she will be declared as dis-collegiate and a dis-collegiate student shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher semester. He/she will need to pursue the semester afresh in which he/she was declared as dis-collegiate along with the next fresh batch.

Examination and Evaluation:

The examinations of Higher Secondary Programme will be held as per the notified schedule of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC). There will be one in-semester examination and one end-semester examination per semester under Under Graduate (U.G.) Programme. The end-semester examination is compulsory for all students and absentee students will not be allowed to appear in the end- semester examination. The examinations of U.G. Programme will be conducted as per Dibrugarh University Examination Regulation, 1972 (with latest amendments) and the guidelines of the NEP, 2020 as stated below:

- Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a semester including the End Semester Examination.
- (ii) There shall be 20% marks for in-semester assessment and 80% marks for Endsemester Examination in each course during every semester.
- (iii) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation for the answer scripts of the Endsemester examinations. However a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

In-Semester Assessment:

- (i) In In-semester assessment, different tools such as objective test, written test, assignment, paper presentation, laboratory work etc. suitable to do courses may be employed.
- (ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend In-semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End- Semester Examination. A student can not repeat In-Semester Examinations. The departments/ Center for Studies may arrange special in-semester examinations whenever necessary.

End-Semester Examination:

- There shall be one End-Semester Examination carrying 80% marks in each course of a semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course.
 The End-Semester Examination is normally a written/ laboratory based examination/ Project Work/ Dissertation.
- (ii) The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End-Semester Examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the university.
- (iii) The time given for End-Semester Examinations for each Course shall be based on the Credits/Marks of the Course.
- (iv) Emphasis needs to be given on problem solving, application level questions as prescribed by the National Education Policy, 2020. The question paper should include different forms of question.

Confidential Works:

Setting Question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcement of results, shall be governed by the Dibrugarh University Examination Ordinance.

The Mode of the Conduct of the End-Semester Examinations of the Practical/ Dissertation Courses shall be partially external as below –

- (i) The End-Semester Examinations of all practical/ Dissertation Courses shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of the Internal Examiner (the concerned course teacher) and an External Examiner appointed by the Controller of Examinations.
- (ii) A student shall not be allowed to take more than one full course as Project Work in a single semester.
- (iii) End-Semester Practical Examinations shall normally be held before the Theory Examination.

(The mode of End-Semester Examination and evaluation of the Course shall be specified in the detailed syllabus of the Course concerned.)

Betterment Examination:

- (i) A Student shall be entitled to take the 'Betterment Examinations' in any two theory courses after successful completion of three year/four year programme only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidate shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth / Eight Semester Examination. Students shall have to appear in the betterment examination with the regular batch.
- (ii) No betterment shall be allowed in the Practical/ Project/ Dissertation/ Internship Examinations.

Result and Progression:

A candidate shall be declared as passed a programme, provided he/ she secures -

- (i) At least 40% of marks in each Course in the End-Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations.
- (ii) At least 'P' Grade in the 10 point scale combining both the In-semester and End-semester Examinations performance.

- (iii) There shall be no separate pass mark for In-semester Assessment.
- (iv) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/programme, provided he/ she secures at least 'P' Grade in the 10 point scale in all the courses separately.
- (v) There may be moderation of In-semester examination marks/ Endsemester marks as an when necessary.
- (vi) The marks of In-semester Examination obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- (vii) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more Courses of any End-semester Examination up to 5th Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. If a candidate fails in any of the components (either theory or practical) of a course, the candidate shall have to reappear in the examination for both the components.
- (viii) If a candidate clears the 6th Semester Examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the 6th Semester Examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
- (ix) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of 7th Semester Examination shall be provisionally promoted to the 8th Semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). If a candidate clears the 8th Semester Examination before clearing all the courses of the 7th Semester, the result of the 8th Semester Examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her result shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semester.
- (x) A student must clear all his her semester examinations within 6 (six) years for three year under graduate programme and 7 (seven) years for four year under graduate programme (with Honours / Research) from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the students.
- (xi) Since the semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be more scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.

- (xii) A candidate shall be declared to have passed provided he/ she has passed all the semesters and in all the Courses separately for the concerned programme.
- (xiii) The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of different programmes and issue Grade – Sheets. The merit list shall be prepared only for the regular candidates and it does not include the backlog candidates.
- (xiv) The first rank holder of a programme shall be decided on the basis of the CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average). However, the Overall Weighted Percentage of Marks (OWPM) of a candidate shall be considered in case of tie in CGPA.
- (xv) Results of the candidates appeared in the betterment or backlog examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/ Medals, Rank or Distinction.

Provision of Multiple Exit:

Exit 1 – There is a provision of exit after successful completion of one year (two semesters). A certificate will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 1 (two semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 44 Credits will be awarded a UG certificate (in the field of study / discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/ skill based vocational course/ internship of 4(four) credits within one year from the completion of second semester examination.

Exit 2 – There is a provision of exit after successful completion of two years (four semesters). A Diploma will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year two (4 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 88 credits will be awarded a UG Diploma (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4^{th} semester examination.

Exit 3 – Three Year UG Programme (BA, B.Com. and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 3 years (six semesters). Students who wish to undergo a three year UG Programme shall be awarded UG degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 132 credits.

Four Year UG Programme with Honours (B.A, B. Com. and Bachelor in other discipline) with Single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4 year (8 semesters) UG Programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years with Discipline Specific Elective Course in 7th and 8th semesters in lieu of Research Project and Dissertation, securing a minimum of 176 credits.

Four Year UG Programme with Honours with Research (BA, B. Com, and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4 year (8 semesters) UG Programme shall be awarded UG Honours with Research Degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years, with Research Project and Dissertation in 7th and 8th Semesters, securing 176 credits.
